

Grading system

Article 1 Course assessment

(I) All courses arranged by the school shall be assessed. According to the category of each course, assessment forms including written tests, oral tests, and paper reports are adopted, and in general, the written test time is two hours;

(II) The assessment score counts the daily performance and final exam result, and in principle, the daily performance shall not account for more than 30% of the total score of the course;

(III) The score of theoretical courses is assessed by the hundred-mark and five- (eleven-) scoring systems (A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, C-, D, D-, and F); the score of practical courses is assessed by the five- (eleven-) scoring system (A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, C-, D, D-, and F); the score of special courses is assessed by the two-scoring system (P: passed; L: failed);

Article 2 Academic record

All assessment scores and credits shall be truly and completely recorded in Transcript. The score of students who take the same course more than once shall be all recorded in Transcript, and that being obtained through retaken classes shall be marked. The Transcript shall be timely filed in documentary and personal archives by the college (faculty) after the students have left school.
